## HOSPITAL DOTS LINKAGE ACTION PLAN DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOP

Yogyakarta, Indonesia  
January 25-30, 2010

Application deadline: November 15, 2009

### Background

- Many high-burden countries (mainly Asian), have a large public and private hospital sector that has never been fully engaged in DOTS expansion, despite the fact that large numbers of TB patients seek care at hospitals.
- Providers in these hospitals often do not follow the national guidelines for diagnosis and treatment of TB patients resulting in poor treatment outcomes, increasing risks for mortality and drug resistance.
- The DOTS Expansion Working Group of the Stop TB Partnership strongly promotes public-private mix (PPM) initiatives including the expansion of quality TB diagnosis, treatment, and care among providers in hospitals through the hospital-DOTS linkage (HDL) strategy.

### Target participant:

PPM focal points from HBCs who are directly involved in implementation of HDL activities, representatives of professional societies, representatives of medical services departments, and NTP representatives (4- 5 persons per country; in total 20-25)

### Course objectives:

By the end of the training participants are able:

1. To make actual situation analysis in regards of HDL in their respective countries;
2. To use the state-of-the-art tools, e.g. "Guiding principles and practical steps for engaging hospitals in TB care and control"; "Guidance document to engage all providers"; "National Situational Analysis Tool"; "The ISTC Handbook and training materials for ISTC"
3. To develop action plans for HDL in high burden countries for involvement of hospitals in DOTS strategy and for building linkages with the public health network based on the actual situational analysis using the log frame approach.
